Alpha's Leadership Development Institution on full display during the Martin Luther King Jr. Day Festivities





Remembering Bro. Joseph McMillan, Jr.

In January, the Gamma Eta Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. celebrated the transition of Bro. Dr. Joseph Turner McMillan Jr. to Omega Chapter.

Brother McMillan was born on July 19, 1944 in Valdosta, GA, the eldest of three children. Even in his early youth, Bro. McMillan exhibited a love for education, mentoring, and a desire to help others. This passion led him to pursue a Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology from Howard University, where he graduated in 1965. It was at Howard University that Bro. McMillan saw the light of Alpha and was initiated via Beta Chapter into the brotherhood of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. in which he later became a life member. Bro. McMillan went on to expand his education by receiving a Master of Arts degree in Student Personnel Administration from Howard University in 1970; and a Doc-

tor of Education degree in Higher Education Administration from Teachers College, Columbia University, in 1986. He also earned the Certificate in Educational Management from Harvard University during the summer of 1990.

Bro. McMillan was active in civic, cultural, religious, and educational organizations throughout the nation. In the City of Austin, he was a member of the Austin Regional Advisory Board of Chase Bank of Texas; a member of the Certification Advisory Council of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board; and a former member of the Board of Directors of the Greater Austin Chamber of Commerce (1990-1993). Bro. McMillan is most notably remembered as President and Chief Executive Officer of Huston-Tillotson College from July 1, 1988, to June 30, 2000. He was named President Emeritus after his retirement. Serving as the fourth president of what is now Huston-Tillotson University, Bro. McMillan's 12-year legacy included the development of new course majors to address workforce development in Austin; strengthening standards for admission, retention, financial aid eligibility; implementing technology throughout campus; building and maintenance enhancements; the initiation of comprehensive strategic planning processes; and increased financial stability.

On Tuesday, December 12, 2017, Bro. Dr. Joseph Turner McMillan Jr. went from labor to reward surrounded by loving family and friends. On Saturday, January 13, 2018, his life was celebrated at the King-Seabrook Chapel on the campus of his beloved Huston-Tillotson University.
